
CHRISTMAS TREE FESTIVAL:

like to sincerely thank the members of the Church who were involved in this venture.




CENTENARY CELEBRATIONS:




LICENSING CEREMONY

the Councillors' Report. The temporary traffic lights In Watling Street and at the Hat and Feather were mentioned, these lights are necessary as electric cables and fibre optics are being installed in connection with wind turbines at Shotley Field.

The Partnership has applied for two grants from Derwent Valley Area Partnership's 'It's Up2U' scheme, one in respect of Watling Wood and the other is for funding for the newsletter to continue. The Partnership has to give a presentation in respect of these applications and then the community has to vote. **This presentation will take place on Saturday, 2nd March, 2013 at Derwentside College, Consett, between 10 a.m. and 2.30 p.m.,** so please make a note in your diary/calendar because we will need as many people from Leadgate as possible to attend and cast their vote.



COUNCILLORS' REPORTS:

<u>BOWLING CLUB</u> - there has been another incident of anti-social behaviour with benches and seats overturned, bedding plants uprooted and spread over the green which has suffered some minor indentation damage. Councillors STELLING and SHIELD have provided funding for a secure fence at the Club.

<u>OPEN CASTING - BRADLEY OPEN CAST</u> – UK Coal have challenged the decision by the Independent Planning Inspector in dismissing the appeal following the public meeting held in Leadgate Workingmen's Club in March, 2012 – the hearing in the High Court in London is schedule for June of this year.

<u>WATLING WOOD</u> – proposals to re-designate **ALL** of Watling Wood to a Greenfield Site rather than the current Brownfield designation are still being considered.

<u>VILLA REAL BRIDGE</u> - funding for the removal of the bridge and a new road depends on the site being developed for housing and discussions are still ongoing.

<u>WOOD NOT HOUSES</u> – Councillors STELLING and SHIELD are very happy to announce that a new wood, to be called Jubilee Wood, between the by-pass, Willow Crescent, Lilac Place and Laurel Drive has started and over 8,000 are to be planted.

POLICE REPORT FOR PERIOD 13th December, 2012 – 16th January, 2013

A total of 108 calls were made to the police, 13 of which were community related. No dwelling house burglaries were reported, however in Pont Bungalows two sheds were broken into and tools taken.

<u>ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR</u> - at Pont View youths were reported to be playing football in the street and kicking the ball against the telephone box, however when the police arrived there were no youths in the area, officers made enquiries and residents said youths are in the area regularly but just being kids. A local male attended the Doctors' Surgery, whilst intoxicated, to collect medication and because of his condition

his medication was refused, this caused him to 'kick off'. When Officers arrived he was arrested because of his behaviour. Youths were reported playing around rear gardens of Ponthead Mews and local youths who were stopped in the area were warned about their actions. A report was received of youths throwing snowballs in the Annaside Mews area but when officer arrived no youths were in the area.

<u>CRIMINAL DAMAGE</u>: Wing mirrors have been stolen from a car in Durham Road: unknown persons have broken house windows in Bradley Cottages: an unknown person has kicked the rear door, causing damage, to a property in Green Street and the Bowling Club has been targeted again, believed by local youths who have entered the Club upturned plant pots and smeared mud on the pavilion window (see Partnership News for further details).

<u>THEFT</u>: Leadgate Workingmen's Club has had lead removed from the roof: garden furniture, which was found nearby, had been stolen from a property in Ponthead Mews: a report was received of two people breaking into a Council owned vehicle, both were arrested and in Dere Park copper was stolen from the roof of a van.

<u>POSITIVE NEWS</u>: Two males have been charged with a racially aggravated public order offence and criminal damage: one male has been banned from driving following a crash before Christmas: one male has been reported for Theft from Khan's Foodstore: one male has been cautioned for an assault in Khan's Foodstore and a vehicle owner was given a Fixed Penalty Notice for causing an obstruction at the rear of North Cross Street.




