#### **PARTNERSHIP NEWS:**

This month's Partnership meeting was held on Wednesday, 21st February, 2018 at 6.30 p.m. in the Community Centre. Before the meeting started, Ms Linda PEARS, the Partnership Chairperson informed everyone the sad news of the passing of one the Partnership's founding members, Mrs. Jean HUGHES,

who died on Monday, 5<sup>th</sup> February, 2018 aged 80 years. Jean's funeral is on Tuesday, 27<sup>th</sup> February, 2018, at 2 p.m. at Mountsett Crematorium. One of the many things Linda said she would remember Jean for was telling her (Linda) it was time to close the meeting as she (Jean) wanted to be home to watch the football. After this a minutes silence was held.

100 years since World War One ended: One of the suggestions to mark this anniversary was perhaps a wooden cross could be made. Leadgate Methodist Chapel has indicated perhaps it could be placed on their land as some of the ladies are busy knitting poppies. Another suggestion is a musical evening, but at the moment the two choirs suggested are unable to confirm their availability: the suggested dates are either Wednesday, 7th or Thursday, 8th November, 2018. The Chairperson, Linda, has been busy trying to make papier-mache poppies, similar to those placed around the Tower of London last year, but of course not of china. When Linda is confident with her poppy, she hopes to take it to local schools and show the children how to make them. The Community Centre Committee has agreed to purchase one of the £250.00 'Silent Soldiers' which will be placed on the War Memorial. It is hoped to have a parade, starting at the 'Old Co-op Building', walking along the footpath (walking on the footpath means a road closure will not be necessary) and finally arriving at the War Memorial in Durham Road, where the Remembrance Day service will be held. It is hoped to obtain poppies seeds to scatter around the village and finally wouldn't it be great if everyone in the village could make a poppy. A pattern for a knitted poppy can be obtained from the Community Centre.

A 'Big Spring Clean' weekend is taking place from  $2^{nd} - 4^{th}$  March, 2018. On  $2^{nd}$  March, 2018 Leadgate Primary School will be out between 10.30 a.m. and 12 noon and on  $3^{rd}$  and  $4^{th}$  March the Taskforce and volunteers will be out between 10 a.m. and 12 noon. Anyone wishing to volunteer should be at the Community Centre for 10 a.m., all equipment will be provided.



#### **COUNCILLORS' REPORTS:**

<u>VILLA REAL BRIDGE/NEW ROAD</u>: The introduction of the buffer 40 m.p.h. speed limit between Leadgate and Villa Real bungalows is awaited, which will allow additional 30 m.p.h. roundel signs to be erected (approximately 5 metres west at the island crossing) reminding motorists that they are entering Leadgate Village and that a 30 m.p.h. speed restriction is in place.

**EDEN MINERS INSTITUTE HALL (THE TUTE)**: Agreement with the Derwent Valley Allstars (a cheerleading/gymnastic group) to enter into a fixed tenancy agreement is still to be finalised. Disposal of the redundant gym equipment to generate some much needed income is progressing to ensure the upkeep of the building.

**SHOTLEY BRIDGE COMMUNITY HOSPITAL**: Discussions regarding the operational set up of the hospital are progressing with a preliminary commitment by the NHS to introduce a new Community Hospital facility off-site (within the Consett locality). The range of services it plans to provide at this facility is still be finalised.

**OPEN CASTING (BRADLEY SITE)**: The Bradley Open Cast site is to be managed by Banks Mining Group who intend to start operational duties in March, 2018 with the installation of the access road, with actual mining in the Pont Valley north of the A.692/693 road junction expected to commenced June/July, 2018. A liaison committee made up of local stakeholders/residents from the surrounding localities (Leadgate, Medomsley and Dipton) has been created to monitor the whole operational process, highlighting issues that Banks will address, the Chair for the committee is Councillor Alan SHIELD.

MANUFACTURING DEVELOPMENT (BRADLEY INDUSTRIAL ESTATE): A manufacturing company, SDS (production of recycled briquettes, generating surplus electricity into the National Grid) is planning to extend their development following a loan via Business Durham, with a significant extension. This extension (if approved by Durham County Council Planning) will be at the top area of Werdohl Way with minimal incursion into Bradley Wood – elected members have registered concerns/objections regarding the actual location of this extension

With summer coming, it is believed there will be an increase in shed burglaries and theft of garden equipment. Durham Constabulary would like to remind people that small measures can prevent these crimes occurring – physically check your car is locked – sometimes central locking can fail: do not keep valuables in your vehicle: do not keep work equipment such as tools and electrical items in the vehicle. Take reasonable steps to secure all out buildings and sheds and remove valuable items if possible: a shed alarm may be an option.




