On Saturday 5th March, 2011 the 'Jolly Drovers' public house once again hosted our village's very own 'LOSCA' ceremony and again all proceeds from the night went to the North East Air Ambulance Service. The event was organised by Mrs. Kate COLQUHOUN and Mr. Ronnie KAY, licensee of the 'Jolly Drovers, two representatives from the Air Ambulance Service attended and presented the awards. On the night, a total of £175 was handed over to the two

representatives and then a further donation of $\pounds 20$ was received, a charity box in the pub raised another $\pounds 80$, so to everyone who contributed, a very big thank you. Here's a little bit of information about the Air Ambulance Service - there are two helicopters in use, to cover an area from Berwick to the North Yorkshire border and they can cover a distance of 200 miles within 20 minutes, the service receives no funding and to keep one helicopter flying the cost is 3.6 million pounds. PARTNERSHIP NEWS:

At this month's meeting, held on Wednesday, 16th March, 2011, Mrs. Corinne WATSON, Co-ordinator for the Area Action Partnership attended and gave an overview of what her duties were, her primary role being to support local Partnerships and to help with publicity.

Councillor STELLING stated someone had been seen surveying our dilapidated bridge but who it was is not known!!! Councillor STELLING also stated if we wished to have a Christmas tree in our village, Durham County Council would charge approximately £4,000 to install mains electricity, unfortunately the Partnership doesn't have that kind of money, so if we want a Christmas tree, a grant will have to be obtained, he also stated it would preferable for Durham County Council to do this work

Comments, all favourable, were made about the demise of the 'Commercial' public house (which apparently has been in our village since the late 19th century) and how much tidier the site now looks, the work was carried out by a local man, Kevin MOODY, of Ebchester.

As you know the Police and Community Together meetings are now being held on the fourth Thursday of every month, but the meeting felt they would be more fruitful if they were held on the same night as the Partnership meeting, but commencing at 6 p.m.

As the light nights approach, there will be more opportunities for activities for 'Leadgate Capers', but don't forget, children have to be members and membership forms can be obtained from Leadgate DIY Shop or from Ms Linda PEARS, telephone number 01207 505481. It was decided the Partnership together with Consett YMCA would hold another Activity Day on Saturday, 20th August, 2011.



POLICE REPORT – for period 8th February – 9th March, 2011:

Once again it has been a relatively quiet month, out of 78 calls made to the police only 13 were community related. There were again no burglaries of any kind and no alcohol seizures, but don't forget if you come across youths drinking or any drinking dens please let us know.

There have been 4 incidents of anti-social behaviour none of which were linked, 5 calls received concerning off road bike incidents, one bike has been seized and 2 written warnings issued, these incidents occurred in the areas of Pont Wood and the field between Pont and Bradley Bungalows. There was one offence of criminal damage to property: 3 motor vehicles have been damaged and it is believed two of these incidents are related, they occurred in the Willow Crescent area and as a result there will be more patrols in the area.


Bogus callers have not made an appearance in our area, but don't forget if anyone comes to your door and wants to gain access to your property, please ask for identification, don't let anyone into your home without identification, if the caller is genuine, he/she will not mind waiting whilst you check. Last month we told you about a telephone scam that was reported to us, this is just a reminder, of how the scam works, someone will ring your landline to say you are owned XX amount of cash as a council tax rebate, they will then ask for your bank details, if you don't give these details, they will then give you a number to ring and a number to quote, **DON'T RING THE NUMBER OR GIVE YOUR BANK DETAILS TO ANYONE OVER THE TELEPHONE,** if in any doubt, hang up.

The next Police and Community Together meeting will be held in the Community Centre on Thursday, 28^{th} April, 2011 between 18:00 - 19:00 - NOTE NEW TIME, this is an opportunity for members of the public to speak to the police. Members of the public will decide how Leadgate is policed, this is what we call a PACT PRIORITY, at the moment **SPEEDING** is the PACT Priority. The last meeting was very poorly attended and if you do not attend and voice your concerns there will be no PACT Priority as the public decide these Priorities not the police.

Please continue to utilise the "Street Safe" box in the Post Office and as always, PCSO Michael CRAINE and PC JOHN HENDERSON are available to speak to whenever you see them and don't forget, whichever way you pass on information it will be dealt in the strictest of confidence.






THANK YOU:
