NEW PRACTICE FACILITY:

Over the last three years, Leadgate Cricket Cricket Club has been working to make its clubhouse and ground as accessible as possible to all users and also to improve the playing and practice facilities available to its teams. The latest stage of this refurbishment, **new practice nets**, was officially opened on 2nd May, 2019.

In the past players had to use an artificial strip in the centre of the ground for net sessions but this could not be used during matches and didn't allow for different players to undertake different technical training sessions.

Two lane practice nets have now been officially opened by local councillors, Watts STELLING and Alan SHIELD, alongside Durham County Cricket Club players Stuart POYNTER and Josh COUGHLIN.

Leadgate Cricket Club was founded in 1904 and now runs two senior men's team, a ladies XI and a number of junior sides across five age groups, ranging from under nines to under 18's. The Club, whose members have been fundraising themselves, received a grant of $\pm 5,000$ from the Banks Group's Bradley Community Fund, towards this new facility.



SURGERY NEWS - MISSED APPOINTMENTS:

Leadgate Primary School still has nursery places available for September, 2019. Give your child the best possible start to their learning career. The nursery is run by a highly skilled, fully qualified teacher and all support staff are Level 3 trained. It is fully integrated into school life with a great outdoor space and regular visits to the allotment and forest school activities. It also includes a healthy breakfast, fruit snack each day and dinners are provided by Taylor Shaw from the school kitchens. This gives your child the tools needed to make the transition from Nursery to Reception. The school also offers 30 hours provision on a first come first serve basis. The Chair, Miss Linda PEARS in her report outlined everything that had taken place last year and stated it had been a very good and busy year. Mrs. Vera PARNABY informed the meeting that in 2018 the Poppy appeal had raised over \pounds 40,000 compared with \pounds 34,000 for 2017.

On 13th May, 2019 a meeting took place in the Community Centre concerning Leadgate becoming an 'Alzheimer Village'. Those people who attended felt it was a good idea and a training session was arranged for 20th May. Some of the things that cause problems to dementia/Alzheimer suffers are patterned floors - they think it's moving: a black floor - they think it is a hole: dark toilet seats - they think it is also a hole: mirrors can also cause problems. Normal every-day things which are taken for granted can cause anxiety to dementia/Alzheimer suffers.

Speeding was once again discussed and it was suggested that perhaps a meeting with representative from Durham County Council, the police and local councillors should be arranged. A pelican crossing was suggested for Front Street, in the vicinity of the 'bus stop and possibly traffic speed indicators at Bradley Cottages.

COUNCILLORS' REPORTS:

PLAY PARK (PONT/WATLING): Durham County Council (DCC) Assets/Estates and DCC Legal are still in discussion to extend the lease (e.g. 25 years) for this site and hopefully arrangements will be shortly concluded to allow the progress to develop/extend the play park.

A planning application to build nine (9) bungalows opposite the play park will be considered by North Durham Planning Committee in May/June, concerns have been registered by local residents and the local councillor of the area.

SHOTLEY BRIDGE COMMUNITY HOSPITAL – Public engagements meetings have now been completed with good attendance by local residents outlining their needs/aspirations for the new Community Hospital to consider what type of health care services will be delivered. There will now be a period of consultation with various stakeholder organisations and a decision (including the proposed location of the new hospital) is expected thereafter, NHS services will continue at Shotley Bridge Hospital until the new Community Hospital is provided.

<u>CHRISTMAS TREE</u> - The living Christmas tree (funded by councillors) has been ordered and a delay in delivery has occurred, it is hopefully to be planted at the 'Gap Site' (within a protective steel enclosure) as soon as possible.


<u>BRADLEY OPEN CAST</u> – Operations to win and mine the coal on the existing Bradley site are ongoing with intermittent blasting occurring. Sampling and core testing in the West Bradley site are progressing and an application by the Banks Group to win/mine open cast coal on this West Bradley site may be submitted to DCC later this year. For information, when red flags are being displayed, this means that blasting is taking place.

<u>PARKING (FRONT STREET)</u> – Quotations are still awaited by DCC Highways Design Officers for the installation costs to create two separate (block paved) hard standing areas for up to eight (8) vehicles with reduced kerb height opposite some of the commercial outlets on Front Street.

SPEED MONITORING – Meetings are being arranged with DCC Highways Officers and Durham Traffic Police to consider deterrent measures to offset the ongoing issues with the speed of traffic entering and exiting the village.
