WELLNESS ON WELLS (WOW) VEHICLE:

'As you know the WOW vehicle has been parked on the Community Centre's car park since 24th February, 2012. A meeting has been held recently with the organisers and members of the Community Centre's committee and as a result of this meeting it appears this facility has been very well used. One of the aims of this vehicle is to have mini gyms or as they are known

'Legacy Gyms' set up in areas where the vehicle has been located. Well you may be pleased to know, Leadgate is going to have its own 'Legacy Gym' situated in the Community Centre. The equipment will by now have been ordered but it takes between 6-8 weeks for it to arrive, so our very own gym will not be up and running before the end of June. I understand volunteers who wish to run the gym have been identified and are to be trained in due course. At the moment no details of times, cost (obviously there will have to be a charge) etc. are available, when they are they will be printed in the newsletter and possibly notices placed in some of the local shops, so watch this space.

On behalf of everyone I wish Mary well in her much deserved retirement and to give a warm welcome to Malcolm and Sue and to wish them well in their venture.

PARTNERSHIP NEWS:

This month's Partnership meeting was held on Wednesday, 18th May, 2012 and one of the items discussed was the 'sponsorship of a flower tub'. Last year the Partnership had 6 flower tubs placed in various locations in the village and paid Durham County Council for two plantings, the first being the summer one last year and the second will be spring this year. After this the planting of the tubs will be the responsibility of the village. The Partnership is hoping residents, organisations or even schools may wish to sponsor one of them, this would mean responsibility for the planting and watering (should the necessity arise). The Partnership has been told if bulbs etc. are bought the County Council would be happy to plant them. The County Council is to be contacted about providing some of the bulbs they dig up every year.

The 'Jubilee Celebrations' was discussed, in February's issue when I said Leadgate Methodist Chapel was going to hold a celebration on 5th June, 2012 but this has now been changed to Saturday, 2nd June, 2012 and they have decided to hold a 'Jubilee Shared Tea' between 3 – 5 p.m., the church hall will be decorated and they ask anyone who wishes to attend, to bring something to eat, not just for themselves but to be shared by everyone. If the weather is good, the event may even be held outside.

There was no Councillor's Report.

POLICE REPORT FOR PERIOD 6th March - 5th April, 2012

During this period 110 calls were received of which only 21 were community related. There have been two dwellinghouse burglaries reported, both in the Bradley Cottages area: one was an attempted burglary by an unknown person who tried to gain entry by means of the rear entrance: the second was an aggravated burglary committed by two males who were known to the victim, both these males have been arrested and are now

remanded in custody. Various locations in the area have had sheds burgled or attempts have been made to burgle sheds, so please continue to lock and if possible alarm sheds and garages and keep valuables out of sight. Several incidents of anti-social behaviour have also been reported including youths climbing scaffolding, these youths were return home by officers: an 'off road bike' has been causing a nuisance in Watling Bungalows, but the rider disappeared before officers arrived: two calls were received concerning 'off road bikes' in Pont Wood and on one occasion a Warning Notice was issued: there have also been incidents of 'off road bikes' using the cycle track and two bikes have been seized in relation to these incidents: youths who were being verbally abusive in Church Street were spoken to and warned about their behaviour.

A female has been arrested for causing Criminal Damage to a vehicle in Baker Street and in St. Ives Road the window of a property was damaged with what is believed to have been an air rifle.

In Pont Lane a wooden gate was stolen: at Iveston a metal gate which had been replaced by a wooden one was stolen after it was left in a field overnight and in Baker Street a wheelie bin has been stolen.


'Operation Strugis' which is targeting 'off road bikes' has had a good start with two bikes being seized and one Warning Notice being issued.
