POLICE REPORT

This month's Police and Communities Together meeting took place prior to the Partnership meeting on 20th May, 2015 and it seems our village has had another relatively quiet month. However one male from the village has appeared at court recently for the cultivation of cannabis and was fined and ordered to pay court costs. Another local man, identified via C.C.T.V. situated

in the Co-op Supermarket attended Consett Police Office and was given a caution for an offence of theft. An unknown person appears to have damaged the skylights at the entrance of the Methodist Church.

As a result of intelligence concerning drugs, a vehicle was stopped in Front Street and drugs were found. The occupants of the vehicle went into a nearby house and they together with the occupants of the house are likely to go to court.

On 7th May, 2015 the Community Speed Watch team were outside Kerbside Motors for 25 minutes and observed 61 vehicles, 11 of which were speeding: on 15th May they were there for 35 minutes and observed 40 vehicles, 3 of which were speeding.

FREE FAMILY DAY:



AT LAST IT'S ABOUT TO HAPPEN:

Well, the day many of us thought would never arrive, is finally here and it is Tuesday, 26th May, 2015. On this day, essential roadworks to improve the layout of Leadgate Road, which connects Villa Real to Front Street, Leadgate will begin and will consist of three phases.

PHASE ONE - the roadworks will close Leadgate Road, from Leadgate Bypass to West Street (except for local access) from 26th May, 2015 to the beginning of August, 2015. The road will be shut as the bridge supports need to be removed to allow new cabling to be installed.

PHASE TWO –following further inspections, the bridge will re-open to traffic from the beginning of August, 2015 until the autumn/winter 2015. The new cabling will then be installed.

PHASE THREE – this will involve the demolition and removal of the bridge and a new highway layout will be completed. These roadworks will continue until spring/summer 2016.

<u>ALTERNATIVE ROUTES</u> – Leadgate Bypass is an alternative diversion route for general traffic. Buses will be diverted via Werdohl Way and New Watling Street with temporary bus stops in place.

WHY IS THE WORK BEING CARRIED OUT?

The improvements will involve removing the old bridge, which was previously used by the railways and currently causes a bottleneck for users of the road: removing the traffic lights, which only allow the flow of traffic in one direction at any one time and replacing them with a straight road, allowing the continuous flow of two way traffic: providing crossing islands for both pedestrians and cyclists, including part of the C to C cycle route: replacing the path that runs under the bridge: landscaping to reshape and improve the existing embankments: providing bus laybys. Once the bridge is removed any future maintenance will be not be necessary.


