REDWELL HILLS CARE HOME:

On 30th April, 2011 Redwell Hills Care Home had the official opening of a 'Memory Garden' at the rear of the premises. This Garden was the brain child of Mrs. Kath. JONES, whose husband, Philip had been one of the Home's residents. The work was carried out by Groundwork West, the Prince's Trust and also Mr. David SHIELDS and his volunteers. Some of the money needed

for this venture was raised by the Home's employees and visitors having various fund raising events. One of the features of the Garden is a water fountain which was donated by Mrs. JONES and her family in memory of husband and father, Philip.

Redwell Hills was opened in June 1990 on the site of the former St. Ives Church School and here's a little bit of history of the site. The school was originally erected in 1860 as a Roman Catholic School (I don't suppose many people knew that) and in 1863 it became St. Ives Church School but was generally known in the village as 'The Hills School'. In 1921, about 3 a.m. one morning the building was extensively damaged by fire and by 1925 it had been renovated with new classrooms and it remained a school until approximately 1981 when it closed. The building was used for various purposes until, in 1990 it was opened as a Care and Residential Home. If anyone knows what the building was used as between 1981 and 1990 would you please let me know as I am sure Leadgate and District Historical Society would be interested.

Councillor STELLING also informed the meeting that the appeal by UK Coal against Durham County Council's decision to refuse their planning application for further opencast workings between Dipton and Bradley, will be heard in Leadgate Workingmen's Club and will start on Tuesday, 25th October, 2011 at 10 a.m. and is expected to last 16 days.

The Partnership together with the Y.M.C.A. will be holding another 'Activity Day' this year, it will on Saturday, 20th August, 2011 between 2 pm and 5 pm and once again the Community Centre will be used for a 'Table Top Sale', anyone wishing to have a table, please contact the Centre's Secretary, Brenda SURTEES ON 01207 507506, as usual the tables will be £5 each. Last year the 'Scarecrow Festival' proved such a success we are having another one this year, so start putting your thinking caps on, the date for this year's festival is 12th – 19th September, 2011.

LEADGATE CAPERS: During the month of May, this group were taken Zorb, Archery and Climbing and in August they will be going Coasteering, Gorge Walking and River Walking. Don't forget if your child/children would like to partake in these events they have to be a member of Leadgate Capers and to become a member all it takes is to fill in a form.



POLICE REPORT for period 11th April to 13th May, 2011

This month there were only 90 calls made to the police, a reduction on last month, of these only 7 were community related. Another month has passed and there have been no alcohol seizures in the Leadgate area, but don't forget if you see any youths drinking or come across any drinking dens, please inform the police.



Some crime prevention advice, as the warmer weather is here please by wary of keeping doors and windows open as this is an invitation to would be thieves, always leave valuables such as car keys, wallets, mobile 'phones away from windows and doors. This month a container, in the Brooms Lane area, was broken into and a large amount of metal was stolen. One incident of criminal damage (a vehicle was scratched) has been reported. 'Operation Livorno' is still running. This operation targets street drinking and the anti-social behaviour caused by it, over the last few months no incidents of street drinking in our area have been reported. There have been 4 incidents of off road bikes/quads being used, one rider was caught and issued with a warning notice that lasts for 12 months and if the rider is caught within that period their bike/quad is confiscated. One incident of anti-social behaviour has been reported in our area (this is the lowest across the whole of the Consett area) and this involved female youths throwing stones at a house window, fortunately no damage was caused.

As you all know speeding is a problem in our area and is a PACT priority and as a result of this priority, a safety camera van was deployed in the St. Ives Road area for a short period of time. 12 vehicles were caught, traffic officers issued 9 fixed penalty notices. The result of such a notice is a fine of £60 and 3 penalty points on a driving licence. A large number of people were stopped and given verbal warnings and 3 vehicles have been caught using the community speed visor. From a previous operation targeting speeders it was found that the majority of offenders come from the Leadgate area.

The next PACT meeting will be on Thursday, 23rd June, 2011 at 6 p.m. in the Community Centre, please come along and air your views. We now have a replacement Beat Officer, her name is P.C. LOUISE RAMSHAW and she is replacing P.C. John HENDERSON and don't forget, both P.C. RAMSHAW and PCSO Michael CRAINE are available to speak to whenever you see them out and about and any information received will be dealt with in the strictest confidence. The 'Street safe' box is still situated in the Post Office so please continues to use it. Finally, any enquiries please contact


