SURGERY NEWS - MISSED APPOINTMENTS:

April was a better month than March as there was a reduction in the number of missed appointments, April had 161 missed appointments: March had 191, however April, 2017 had only 141

Don't forget, waiting times for appointments can be long but this can be overcome with patients' help if you are unable to keep your appointment please cancel it and allow someone else the chance to have it.

Our surgery had introduced a new service to help the increasing demand from patients who need **urgent**, on the day, medical attention. If there are no face to face appointments available patients will be offered a telephone appointment and the duty doctor will ring to assess your need and may ask you to attend the surgery. The surgery does not have the capacity to offer a truly **walk-in service** and hope the service they do offer goes some way to improve patient's experience. If you do call into the surgery on the day for an urgent appointment you may be asked to return home and wait for a telephone call.

<u>1918 -2018 Celebrations</u>: A meeting was held at Leadgate Methodist Church on 15th May, 2018 to work out how many people the Church's hall could accommodate for a tea dance to be held on Saturday, 7th July, 2018 from 2 p.m., to cover the cost of catering tickets will cost \pounds 2.50 each and admission will be by ticket only, when available they can be obtained from Forster's, Davison's, Miss Linda PEARS, telephone 01207 505481 or Miss Brenda SURTEES, telephone 01207 507506. COUNCILLORS' REPORTS:

OPEN CASTING (BRADLEY SITE): Work on the Bradley Open Cast site is progressing with the A.692 roadway being widened to provide for a right hand turn (on the westbound carriageway) and a new roadway into the site to facilitate the movement of heavy goods vehicles (64 per day) into and off site – this has necessitated the closure of the north side footpath which has caused access issues to pedestrians using wheelchairs/pushchairs. Police have reported that ongoing requirement for frequent Police presence (at the Open Caste site) regarding protestors incidents is having an impact on Neighbourhood Police availability to address local issues.

EDEN MINERS INSTITUTE HALL ('THE TUTE'): The Trustee Board have met with the organisers of the other interested dance group (Inspirer la Dance) who provide ballet, tap, modern and freestyle dance options and further discussions are to be scheduled to hopefully finalise arrangements to commence this provision.

SHOTLEY BRIDGE COMMUNITY HOSPITAL: The next meeting with N.H.S. Officers concerning the operational set up of a hospital, regarding their findings and recommendations to introduce a new Community Hospital facility off-site (probably within the Consett locality) is scheduled for Tuesday, 29th May, when the proposal on the proposed location and the range of services it plans to provide at this facility will be explained.

WATLING WOOD AND MANUFACTURING DEVELOPMENT (BRADLEY INDUSTRIAL ESTATE) Watling Wood has now been designated as a <u>community asset</u> – this may impact on a planning application of a local company who want to extend their development with a significant extension, as it would include an incursion into Watling Wood.

<u>ROUNDABOUTS</u>: The planned development of the roundabout at the bottom of Durham Road (A691/A692 Interchange) has commenced, replacing the grassed surface with low maintenance shrubbery. The planned development of the Jolly Drovers roundabout is scheduled between November, 2018 – January/February, 2019.

LEADGATE CRICKET CLUB (BIG BASH 2): Following the huge success of the 1st Big Bash (a free/fun organised community activity) in 2016 which attracted nearly 3,000 visitors, another organised community free/fun activity is being support by local Councillors and is scheduled for 21st and 22nd July. Local community organisations are to be invited to participate and have an opportunity to present/display their wares/activities.

PARKING (WEST STREET): Concerns have been raised about recent incidents of serious parking issues at Leadgate Primary (Lower/Infants) School which may contribute to safeguarding issues affecting the school children – Neighbourhood Police are to exercise close monitoring and action any 'illegal' parking incidents.


