

PARTNERSHIP NEWS:

The meeting, which took place on Wednesday 15th June, 2011 was told as there is now no bus service through Leadgate to Durham on a Sunday, anyone one wishing to travel to Durham on a Sunday has to go to Stanley to catch a bus.

Apparently there are plans afoot for 3,200 new houses to be built in the Derwentside area, this could mean approximately 10,000 more residents and no plans for new infrastructure to support a vast increase in the number of cars or for regeneration, i.e. employment, in other words, the Derwentside area could become a 'computer belt'. Councillor Alan SHIELD, who informed the meeting of these plans, indicated it is his intention to write to our local Member of Parliament, Mrs. Pat GLASS about this situation.

The matter of 'speed bumps' in St. Ives Road was discussed, it is felt that a physical deterrent is required at this location. The proposal is for 8 or 9 cushions to be placed between St. Ives Church and Leadgate Traffic Lights, but as objections have been raised by several residents of St. Ives Road, before a decision can be made, this matter is to be placed before a Durham County Council meeting. Objections have also been received about the siting of a bus shelter in Front Street.

Leadgate's only remaining bridge was brought up once again but as it is owned by Sustrans there is not a lot that can be done until there is an upturn in the economy.

<u>GROTT SPOTS</u> – the walk ways between gardens in the bungalow areas are 'right of ways' not 'public footpaths' and are therefore the responsibility of the residents. If these were tidied up it was suggested the Neighbourhood Warden could supervise them to ensure they were kept tidy.

LEADGATE CAPERS are having only one activity this month, on Saturday, 9th July, 2011 between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. and it is bush craft. August will see more activities, so watch out for next month's issue.

POLICE REPORT – for period 13th May – 9th June, 2011

The number of calls made to the police during this period was 82 of which only 8 were community related. Another month has passed without there any alcohol seizures but as ever if you see any youths drinking or come across drinking dens, please let us know. There were no reports of burglary, however there has been one incident of what appears to be a bogus caller. Two males

entered a house and stated they were carrying out asbestos checks, they did have identity cards but they were not believed to be genuine, fortunately on this occasion nothing was taken. Don't forget **ALWAYS** ask for identification, if you're still in any doubt ask for their company's details and contact their headquarters.

Three incidents of anti-social behaviour have been reported but none were related and compared to other areas this is very low.

There were three incidents of criminal damage: the first was a car wing mirror broken; the second was damage caused to a motor car and a man has been arrested and charged with this offence; the third was damage to a gate. The theft of a quad bike was reported and within a short space of time a male person was arrested for this offence and has been charged.

'Operation Livorno' is continuing to target street drinking and the anti-social behaviour attributed to it and once again, our area has no reported incidents.

Please note the new day for the PACT meeting, this meeting will now be held on the third Wednesday of every month, at 6 p.m. before the Partnership meeting at 7 p.m. and as usual will be held in the Community Centre. This meeting is an opportunity for members of the public to speak to the police and to decide how Leadgate should be policed (this is called a PACT PRIORITY), at the moment speeding is a PACT priority.

Don't forget to continue to use the 'Street Safe' box in the Post Office and remember PCSO Michael CRAINE and PC Louise RAMSHAW are available to speak to whenever you see them in the village. Any information received by the police will always be dealt with in the strictest of confidence.




