

#### PARTNERSHIP NEWS:

This month's Partnership meeting was held on Wednesday, 17<sup>th</sup> July, 2013 and the meeting was told a letter had been received from David CLEUGH, Priest in Charge of St. Ives Church, inviting us to select a hymn, bible reading or poem for inclusion in the 'Songs of Praise' being held on Sunday, 28<sup>th</sup> July, 2013 to celebrate the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Parish of Leadgate and after some discussion, it was decided a poem would be read out by Linda PEARS, Chairperson of the Partnership.

The tennis court site was discussed and it was asked if it was possible to change its use. Councillor STELLING stated the land is owned by the Coal Industry Social Welfare Organisation (CISWO) and they have said the tennis courts have to remain as there may be a renewed interest in tennis, if enough people are interested, perhaps a new tennis club could be formed. The positioning of the 'dog poo bags' was also discussed and it was felt initially they should be placed on the cycle track and the football field.

The Partnership is to hold a 'litter pick' on a monthly basis, on the first Wednesday of every month and the first one will be on Wednesday, 4<sup>th</sup> September, 2013, it will commence at 10.30 a.m. and finish at 11.30 a.m. and people interested should meet at the car park behind the Doctors' Surgery. These litter picks will be sponsored by 'Civic Pride', part of Durham County Council, situated at the Morrison Busty Depot and they will provide everything required, all people need to do is turn up and help improve the look of our village.

The old toilet site, next to the Doctors' Surgery, was discussed: a suggestion was made that it could possibly be tarmacked, but as the land is privately owned this is not possible. The question of litter bins placed at various locations in the village by private individuals and who empties them was also raised as they will not be emptied by the County Council.

Councillor STELLING said another set of plans in respect of Carr House Bridge were being considered by all parties (the third in one year) and it was his and Councillor SHIELD'S main aim to have the bridge removed. The last train through Leadgate under this bridge was in 1984 and talk about this bridge has been going on virtually since then.

Brief mention was made of Thomas Swan's future development and the use of 'digesters' and how it would impact on the village because of farm waste being delivered on a daily basis.

# POLICE REPORT FOR PERIOD 19th June - 17th July, 2013

This month the police received at total of 103 call and only 6 were community related.

The only burglary reported during the above period was at Johnson Buildings, Iveston, when someone attempted to force open a rear door to gain entry.

A report was received of 5 'off road' /quad bikes on the fields to the rear of Park Villas, but when the police attended none were seen but there were signs bikes had been on the field. In Tyne Avenue police attended after a report of an 'off road' bike, which had made off, the police stayed a short while but there was no further sign of the bike.

Numerous reports have been received from Haven House about children kicking footballs towards the building, climbing onto a garage roof and being abusive to residents – the police will be increasing their patrols in the area.



A Magistrate's Search Warrant was executed in the Bradley Bungalows area and a small amount of cannabis was recovered together with stolen property.

On Saturday, 20<sup>th</sup> July, 2013 I was reading Teletext and found the following article which concerns our village '<u>LEADGATE OPENCAST MINE PLANT REVIVED</u>: Plans for a new opencast mine in Leadgate have been revived following a legal challenge. UK Coal had applied for permission to extract 556,000 tonnes of coal from a site near Leadgate but this was rejected by the County Council in 2011. An appeal by the company has been upheld at the High Court in London and the plans will go back to a planning inspector at a public inquiry. Antimine campaigners said UK Coal had not listened to the local community'.


