REMEMBRANCE DAY SERVICE:

This year's Remembrance Day Service will be held on Sunday 8th November, 2015 at 10.30 a.m. at the Cenotaph in Durham Road. For the last few years the service has been attend by more and more people wishing to pay their respects to those people who paid the ultimate price for freedom, let's see if we can continue this trend.

Once again the ladies of the Community Centre's Craft and Chat Club have been hard at work creating another patchwork quilt which has been donated to the Great North Air Ambulance to raise funds.

The Craft Club meets every Thursday afternoon in the Community Centre between 1 p.m. -3 p.m. and everyone is welcome. There is no age limit, at present the ages range from 20 years to the oldest member who has just celebrated her 91st birthday.

Mrs. Jennifer WALKER, the Centre's Treasurer and group tutor said, "People can come along and do whatever craft they want, whether it is sewing, knitting or crochet. They need not do anything at all if they don't want to, they can come along for a coffee and a chat".

LAST FLIGHT:

Recently Britain's last airworthy Cold War Vulcan Bomber began its final season flying. The distinctive delta-winged jet bomber was put back in the air after a nationwide fundraising campaign, but this year finally reaches the end of its flying life. The bomber was restored and returned to flight in 2007 at a cost of more than \pounds 7 million in public donations and lottery money. The Vulcan XH558 was delivered in 1960 and ended service in 1984 but flew until 1992 as the RAF's display Vulcan.



You may be wondering why a picture of this majestic aircraft is appearing in our village's newsletter, well the reason is, about 1.40 p.m. on Saturday, 10th October, 2015 I was one of many people in our region who, I'm sure witnessed this aircraft flying over our village. It is supposed to be very noisy but when it appeared overhead in Leadgate it couldn't be heard. It flew in a straight line and then suddenly turned on its side and those watching were privileged to see its magnificent delta-wing shape before it flew off into the clouds.

Once grounded, the Vulcan will remain on show as part of an exhibition about the Cold War and British engineering.

POLICE NEWS

As there are no more PACT Meetings for the time being, here are a few hints to keep property etc. safe.



MMOBILI

WINTER NIGHTS – during the dark nights burglary crime increases. Take simple steps to keep your house safe - leave lights and alarm on; windows and doors locked; curtains closed and don't leave valuables on view. If your house looks as though it is unoccupied it is more at risk of being targeted - consider timer devises for lights to reduce the risk.

<u>IMMOBLISE</u> - register your property on the immobilise website so if it's stolen and recovered, it can be returned to you. (www.immobilise)



SHOPLIFTING – on the run-up to Christmas, we will be carrying out additional patrols in retail outlets to deter shoplifters. We will also be checking vehicles that are coming into the area to make sure they do not contain known offenders travelling to Durham to commit crime. Please let us know of any outlets where you believe stolen goods are being passed on.

LOCK IT OR LOSE IT – bikes secured properly are rarely stolen. Use a 'D' lock along with another lock to secure your bike. Use a property marker so you can identify it if it's stolen. Register your bike on 'bike register' or 'immobilise' so it can be returned to you if recovered.





PROTECTING CHILDREN – everyone has a part to play in keeping young people and children safe. If you are concerned about the welfare or safety of a child and this requires immediate action call FIRST CONTACT ON 0300026 79 79 or dial 999. If you are suspicious about any activity where you think children could be at risk call 101 and share you concerns - always ring 999 in an emergency.

The Police are looking to start a new format PACT Meeting and will holding a PACT Roadshow on Saturday, 28th November, 2015 between 2 p.m. - 4 p.m. in Leadgate Scout Hut. Everyone is welcome, if you have any suggestions go along and share them. 
