WHAT HAPPENS TO THE CLOTHING WHEN WE COLLECT IT FROM PEOPLE'S DOORSTEPS?

NONE of the clothing we collect gets shredded. We sell it by bulk to second band clothing companies who then sort it and sell it on to second hand clothing shops. The reason we do it like this is so we have a quick turn-around to get the money straight back into keeping the helicopters flying. If we had a shop we would have to sort everything out individually and have the costs of overheads etc.

I can guarantee you that we do get a very good price for it the way we sell it. We sell by the tonne and we get paid for it immediately before it even leaves our warehouse.

- A female has received an £80 fixed penalty for supplying alcohol to youths.






