The shop is open from 5 a.m. until 10 p.m. seven days a week. Local customers will pay only f_1 for two litres of milk and also for a large loaf of bread.

Frozen foods will also be sold and a coffee machine is being installed shortly. On behalf of Leadgate's residents a warm welcome is extended to Robert and Nilani.

PARTNERSHIP NEWS:



This month's Partnership meeting was held on Wednesday, 17th November, 2014 and a minutes silence was held for Mrs. Pat PICKERSGILL, the Partnership's secretary who tragically died in October. The Chair read a letter which had been sent to Pat's brother, David, expressing the Partnership's condolences. Pat will be greatly missed by not only the Partnership, but by many organisations in Leadgate e.g. the Methodist Church, Open Arms and Leadgate Junior School. To her family and all her friends the Partnership offers its most sincere condolences.

A letter has been sent to Morrison Road Nursery complimenting them on the planting of Villa Real Roundabout and saying how we wished we could plant out own gardens in a similar fashion. It has now been confirmed that the spring planting of the villages' planters will be £25 and the summer planting will be £30. Sponsors are required for two planters, if anyone is interested please contact Miss Linda PEARS on 01207 505481. The perennial plants have been removed from the planters and placed in plant pots for the winter and hopefully they will be sold in the spring at local coffee mornings. For those interested, the roundabout at Morrisons' in Consett denotes the steel making process – iron to steel.

A discussion took place concerning the newsletter as to whether or not it should be placed on the Internet only or still printed and distributed and also placed on the Internet – it was felt it should be the latter, always providing there was money available for the printing costs. The next meeting of the Partnership will be on Wednesday, 21st January, 2015 at 7 p.m. in the Community Centre.



COUNCILLORS' REPORTS:

The issue concerning the dismantling of Leadgate Bridge has now been resolved however the agreement has still to be signed: the large drain which was unexpectedly found, has been re-sited by the Water Board and work is now expected to commenced early in the new year.

A walk about with the Independent Planning Inspector who is hearing the appeal concerning the Bradley Open Cast site has taken place and her decision is expected before February, 2015. The amalgamation of the Leadgate Junior and Nursery/Infants school has been approved and the joined schools will be officially classified as the Primary School in April, 2015, with both schools sites being retained.

Once again a discussion took place about a Christmas tree for our village and Councillors STELLING and SHIELD are to ascertain the cost of connecting the 'Gap Site' to the electricity supply. Councillors were informed the cats' eyes on the by-pass and the road to Lanchester were not operating correctly and Durham County Council will be requested to investigate and apply any needed corrective action.



POLICE REPORT

At the moment the PACT Priority is anti-social behaviour in Front Street and at the Community Centre and the police are conducting foot and mobile patrols in the area. There are also anti-social issues in the Patterdale Mews area.

A male person has been arrested and summonsed for causing damage to the metal shutters of Khan's Food Store. A number of calls have been received concerning unknown persons entering the rear yards of properties in the Durham Road/Dunelm Walk areas. Damage has been caused to a motor vehicle and this is under investigation. Damage has also been caused to property at the rear of South Cross Street/Front Street as a result of a bonfire: residents contacted Durham County Council numerous times asking to have it (the bonfire) removed, but to no avail and they were very disappointed (there was an organised bonfire at the Fire Station). A young female had been reported missing but was later found safe and well in the village. A firework had been put through the letter box of a house in Dunelm Walk.

'Operation Spoke' has recently marked its 1000^{th} bike, a lady from Shotley Bridge was the lucky winter of £150 worth of bike equipment/football tickets and a year's subscription to a bike magazine.

'Operation BOOMERANG' 2014 was launched on 5th November, 2014, its objective being to combat organised crime in the Consett area. Since its start the police have had the following successes: a warrant executed in the Delves Lane area resulted in £10,000 worth of a Class 'A' drug being seized along with £6,000 in cash: a proactive stop check of a vehicle revealed a large quantity of cannabis and cash to the value of £6,000 which was seized: a warrant executed in the Burnhope area resulted in a stolen 'wacker plate' and generator being seized: Pege Two another stop check in the Burnhope area resulted in a stolen cement mixer being recovered: a warrant executed in the Bridgehill area resulted in £28,000 worth of a Class 'A' drug being seized along with a motor vehicle and $f_{1,200}$ in cash.


