# PARTNERSHIP NEWS:

Leadgate Area Partnership's latest meeting was held on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> November, 2010

and amongst the items discussed was Durham County Council's '2010 Bulb Planting Challenge'. The County Council's Civic Pride Team, sponsored by all fourteen Area Action

- Partnerships, had a staggering 150,000 crocus bulbs to give to community groups/organisations
- and schools (approximately 200 per group) across the whole of County Durham to plant in their
- local neighbourhood. Many groups and organisations in Leadgate applied and received the bulbs
- free of charge. Approximately 1,400 bulbs have been planted around Leadgate, the challenge
- now is to spot the crocus flowers next spring, that is if the poor bulbs survive in the waterlogged

ground.



The another item of interest was directed towards the YOUNG OF LEADGATE who

The Partnership applied for and has been awarded a large sum of money from the 'Big Lottery' in

order to establish a project entitled 'LEADGATE CAPERS'. It is the Partnership's intention, over the

coming year to treat the young people of Leadgate, between the ages of 8–11 years and 11 years

<u>DELIVERY</u>: Post the application form through the letter box at the Community Centre as soon as


possible.

There has been only one anti-social behaviour call this month which is a massive reduction. There

will be dealt with in the strictest confidence.




