SURGERY NEWS - MISSED APPOINTMENTS:



Last month I reported there had been a slight decrease in the number of missed appointments, however, I am sorry to say there has once again been an increase. In October, 2017 184 appointments were missed: this is equivalent to 46 per week and a total of 42 hours wasted, but I am pleased to say this year's figure is down on October, 2016 when 249 appointments were missed.

Our surgery offers an appointment texting service. If you have a mobile phone, inform the receptionists who will text you the day prior to your appointment, hopefully this will limit the number of missed appointments. Waiting times for appointments can be long but this can be overcome with patients' help, if you are unable to keep your appointment, please cancel it and allow someone else the chance to have it."

The meeting will commence at 6.30 p.m. in the Community Centre and everyone is welcome to attend and to voice their thoughts and ideas





This month's Partnership meeting was held on Wednesday, 15th November, 2017 at 6.30 p.m. in the Community Centre.

Watling Wood was discussed and it was felt a new sign was required: it was also thought that the fencing could be removed and this would allow for the grass verges to be cut, however if it wasn't removed it should be replaced. The dipping platform in the wood has been enlarged but at the moment there is no water, as the bullrushes have soaked it all up. The natural spring is still there but the bullrushes need to be cleaned out

As a result of the new V5 bus service it was felt a 'bus stop was now necessary at the Hat and Feather.

The meeting was informed on Saturday, 18th November, 2017, between 9.30 – 11.30 a.m. the 'Deli Counter' will host 'decoration making': these decorations will be placed on the Christmas tree which will be situated in the Cricket Club ground and the Christmas lights will be switched on at 6 p.m. on 25th November, 2017.

Recently there has been vandalism in Durham Road - approximately 20 vehicles have been damaged, if you have any information please inform the Police.

The editor of the newsletter informed the meeting a donation had been received from the former Leadgate Historical Society towards the printing costs and a letter of thanks will be sent. The meeting was also informed that the copyright for the Leadgate Books, which Mr. Bill STOCKDALE produced, has now passed to another organisation which will be named later.

Plans to commemorate 100 years since World Word One ended were discussed and it was felt that the partnership could purchase a silhouettes of a World War One soldier, being sold by the Royal British Legion and placed at the Jolly Drovers roundabout, another silhouette possibly purchased by another organisation could be placed at the roundabout at the bottom of Durham Road. A pattern for knitted poppies has been obtained and anyone interested in knitting some can obtain a copy of it from the Community Centre foyer.



COUNCILLORS' REPORTS: NEW ROAD/VILLA REAL BRIDGE:

The issue regarding the proposed revised speed limits is to be discussed and decided by Councillors on the Durham County Council (DCC) Highways Committee which is scheduled to meet on Monday, 20th November, 2017 – we await their decision with interest and how they plan to monitor and enforce the new speed limits.

EDEN MINERS INSTITUTE (THE TUTE):

The Derwent Valley Allstars – a Cheerleading/Gymnastics Group have agreed to have specific and sole access to the upper hall on five weekday evenings (4pm - 9pm) – due to commence in February, 2018 following improvements/alterations (new toilets and a new dance floor to be installed).

SHOTLEY BRIDGE COMMUNITY HOSPITAL:

The second meeting with the NHS and CCG is scheduled for 15th December, 2017 and local Councillors will be allowed to review and scrutinise the findings from the NHS regarding the options to be submitted to provide a Community Hospital provision in the Shotley Bridge/Consett locality.

THE ROXY:

Access to grant support from an Art & Leisure foundation is being progress by Business Durham to assist the provision of financial resources to progress the development work on the old Roxy Cinema.

BRADLEY OPEN CAST:

Councillors have been advised that the 'Banks Group' have acquired the rights from UK Coal to open cast the Bradley Site and are currently in discussions with the landowners to finalise approval for the mineral rights.

There is a significant amount of pre-application conditions to be complied with before the 3rd June, 2018 deadline to satisfy the requirements of the Planning Inspector's findings from the public inquiry decision issued on 3rd June, 2015.


Councillors have stressed several concerns regarding the development of the site, especially the access issues leading onto the very busy A.692 road, as well as the restoration bonds to the value of \pounds 5.04 million and the Community Fund proposal of 10p per tonne. Banks Group Officers have requested that a liaison group (from the various stakeholder) – Councillors will be engaging with local organisations and interested residents to formulate representatives from our area.






