## **SURGERY NEWS - MISSED APPOINTMENTS:**

After a decrease in January and February it was quite surprising to see March's figure had once again increased. January's figure was 181 missed appointments and February's was 159, but for some reason March's figure leapt to 201, averaging the equivalent of 50 appointments each week. Waiting times for appointments can be long but this can be overcome with patients' help, if you are unable to keep your appointment, please cancel it and allow someone else the chance to have it." ## **CO-OP COMMUNITY FUND**:

On Wednesday, 19<sup>th</sup> April, 2017 I was present at Leadgate Co-op when the charity 'Open Arms' was presented with a cheque for £3,497.00 from the Co-op's Community Fund. The presentation was made by Mr. David MORDUE, Shop Manager, to Mrs. Marion ROWELL, Secretary of 'Open Arms' the money was raised from the payment of 5p for carrier bags and from the dividend of Co-op members. Since September over £10,000 has been raided and two other groups were the recipients

of over £3,000, they were Consett Churches Detached Youth Project and Minsteracres Retreat Centre. The next round to be selected started on 6<sup>th</sup> April, 2017 and one of the groups is Leadgate Scouts. To take part in the voting you have to be a member of the Co-op: you can become a member by visiting the Co-op's website **coop.co.uk/membership** or call in the shop. On behalf of the Co-op and the groups awarded the money, well done everyone.

In case you are wondering about 'Open Arms', it is a befriending group that meets every Tuesday from 10 a.m. – 2 p.m. in Leadgate Methodist Church Hall, Tyne Avenue. It is open to anyone who is lonely, vulnerable or who just want a chat. Activities, bingo, raffle and a two course lunch are provided: entrance is £1 and lunch costs £4. Why not go along, if it isn't for you, you may be able to become a volunteer and help others.

### **PARTNERSHIP NEWS:**

The monthly meeting of Leadgate Area Partnership was on Wednesday, 19<sup>th</sup> April, 2017 at 6.30 p.m. in the Community Centre.

The Task Force agreed they are happy to take on the summer activities with the Y.M.C.A.

A list of 'hot spots' has been forwarded to the County Council in respect of its' 'Operation Spruce Up'. If you have any suggestions for 'hot spots' why not come to a meeting and put forward your suggestion.

So far as Watling Wood is concerned, the cost of installing two metal seats would be £1,300: pond dipping platform would be £1,300 and boardwalks cost £615 per 3 metre lengths.

The meeting was informed the Cricket Club will be hosting a 'Fun Day' on 16th July, 2017 from 12 noon.

Also Derwentside Homes have amalgamated with two other organisations, ISOS and Cestria and in future the new group will be known as '**Karbon Homes**', which will be one of the top three housing associations in the North East, they own and manage 24,000 homes across the North East and Durham, from Berwick in the North to Stockton in the south and across to Cumbria in the west: they employ almost 800 staff and have an annual turnover of over £130 million.

As membership of the Partnership has dwindled, it was suggested that perhaps the Partnership could take a quieter role and the Task Force take more of a lead, but the Task Force wishes to work alone. New membership of the Partnership is needed or there is a possibility it may cease.

The Partnership was set up a number of years ago to help co-ordinate all the different groups in our village and to promote joint action and improvements for the village. There have been some great successes, but over the years membership has dropped off so it gets harder to get things done and to find volunteers. In the last couple of years the Partnership has still managed to help run some Fun Days, do some litter picking and because of one person's dedication, maintain our lovely flower tubs around Leadgate. The Partnership is still there as a voice for the village, talking to the police and councils, etc. The Partnership's Annual General Meeting is approaching and it really needs some more people to come along and get involved. With groups like the Task Force, the Partnership wants to get the village tidied up, turn Watling Wood into an accessible asset for us all, and help get more things for young and old people to do in the village, but this will only happen if we have some people to take on roles and become committee members. The Partnership doesn't have a complicated set of accounts, but really do need a new treasurer: an assistant for the editor producing this great newsletter and anybody who wants to help improve our village.

The club offered activities for around 20 children aged between 12 – 18, three evenings a week, it also had pool and table tennis facilities and a sports hall where tennis, badminton and football could be played. 
