I am led to understand the work will now be starting week commencing 23rd May, 2016, but again I have to say, 'Watch this space'. Apparently an unexpected electricity cable had been found.

LEADGATE SURGERY INFORMATION:

We all know waiting times for appointments can be long but this delay can be overcome. If an appointment is made and for whatever reason, cannot be kept, **please cancel it.** Figures up to the end of April are as follows:

January 186 - 47 per week: February 189 - 48 per week: March 186 - 47 per week: April 183 – 46 per week



URGENT APPOINTMENTS – the surgery has introduced a new service to help the increasing demand from patients who need **urgent, on the day medical attention.** If there are no face to face appointments available you will be offered a telephone appointment and the duty doctor will ring to assess your need and may ask you to attend the surgery.

THE SURGERY DOES NOT OPERATE A WALK-IN SERVICE. It does not have the capacity to offer a truly walk-in service and hope the service we do offer goes some way to improve patients' experience. If you do call into the surgery on the day for an urgent appointment, you may be asked to return home and wait for a telephone call.



PRESCRIPTION REQUESTS –

Non repeat medication – Please be aware that you may be asked to see a G.P. or Practice Nurse for a medication review when you request medication that is **not** issued on a regular repeat prescription e.g.

- Anti-depressants
- Painkillers
- Creams
- Contraceptive pill
- HRT

You will be asked to make an appointment to see a G.P. or nurse before the prescription will be issued.

REPEAT MEDICATION – Where a review date for repeat medication has passed, you will be asked to see a G.P. or nurse for a medication review and no further prescriptions will be issued.



APPOINTMENT REMINDERS VIA TEXT MESSAGE – The surgery will send a text message reminder **the day before** your appointment giving the date and time, the surgery telephone number and asking you to call if you are unable to attend. If you wish to use this service, you can give your mobile number to a receptionist.

After the AGM an ordinary meeting was held and a discussion took place about the recent award from Tesco's 'Bags of Help' project. How the Partnership intends to spend the money must be made public: some of the money will be spent providing a board walk, pond dipping facilities, metal seats and marginal wet land planting. The Queen's birthday 'street party' was also discussed, it was decided volunteers to be at the Community Centre from 11 a.m. onwards and it was thought it would be great if people attending could be dressed in red, white and blue.



COUNCILLORS' REPORTS:

Villa Real Bridge: The demolition of the bridge scheduled for week commencing 9th May, 2016 was unfortunately delayed as a result of the discovery of an unmarked electrical cable which required the assistance of N.E.D.L. before the cable was considered safe, there was some earthmoving work and an extension of the security fencing to prevent unauthorised access started in the meantime.

Further meetings have been held with the contractor, J.N. BENTLEY and an agreed plan of works (initially the removal of the bridge) has been submitted. The demolition of the bridge will begin on **Monday**, 23rd **May**, 2016 and continue for around two weeks. The demolition will be carried out as follows:

Monday:
Tuesday:Reduce the central piers and wing walls to around 1 metre in height
Remove the east parapets and west wind walls on the approach on the south east side
then commence using a breaker to expose the ends of the bridge deckWednesday:
Thursday onwards:Commence cutting of the deck in situ to break up with a shear cutterThursday onwards:
for transportation away from the site

Durham County Council is still working closely with the Contractor to reduce the time to complete the works and reopen the road. The date for the planned completion will be announced within the next few weeks. Councillor Alan SHIELD (07500125327) Councillor Watt STELLING (07500125328)



POLICE REPORT

This month a Traffic 183 was issued to a local resident in respect of complaints received concerning a red quad bike. As 'off road' bikes seem to be an issue in Leadgate, the police are still keen to receive further information

On Friday, 13^{th} May, 2016 several hotspot areas around Consett were tackled and a large amount of alcohol was confiscated from 15 - 16 year olds. Some of these youths were from Leadgate and attended local secondary schools. Four £90 fines have been issued to adults for supplying children with alcohol: cannabis was also seized from a 16 year old male.

An 'Allotment Watch' initiative has been launched in Consett and the police are looking to see who is interested within the Leadgate area. As an incentive to join, there are 10% off vouchers available from local DIY stores.


