COUNCILLORS' REPORTS:

<u>VILLA REAL BRIDGE</u>: Good progress is being maintained with this project – the removal of the bridge has been completed by Owen PUGH and significant earth moving (landscaping effects to accommodate the spoil material) progress made by the main contract, J. N. BENTLEY. Further work to improve the visual access to Leadgate Cricket club (entering/leaving the village) is to be considered.

DURHAM BRASS: Councillors provided the funding for a group from the Durham Brass Festival to participate at Leadgate Primary School on Thursday, 14th July, 2016. The German Trombone Vibration provided a whole school concert performance and a number of workshops across the school age group – teaching and support staff reported that all the children thoroughly enjoyed the experience.

LOW FREQUENCY NOISE (LFN): The Environment Agency (EA) and Durham Council Council Nuisance Control staff are investigating several reports of low frequency noise ('humming') issues across our local area – monitoring at some local factories are set in place and remedial action will be implemented when the source of LFN is established.


POLICE REPORT:


