SURGERY NEWS - MISSED APPOINTMENTS:

Good news, missed appointments for June were down on May's, in June there were 170 missed appointments, that is equivalent to 42 per week and 40 hours' time wasted. Figures for the previous three months are as follows:

May, 2017 - 203 patients did not attend, an average of 50 per week: time wasted 50 hours

April, 2017 - 141 patients did not attend: an average of 35 per week: time wasted 34 hours

March, 2017 - 201 patients did not attend

Don't forget, our surgery offers an appointment texting service. If you have a mobile phone, inform the receptionists who will text you the day prior to your appointment, hopefully this will limit the number of missed appointments.

PARTNERSHIP NEWS:

This month's Partnership meeting was held on Wednesday, 19th July, 2017 at 6.30 p.m. in the Community Centre

As a result of the sponsorship in respect of the Newsletter ceasing, the Secretary, Mr. Andy PLANT is to investigate the possibility of the R. Young Foundation providing funding and also he has suggested that perhaps he and Brenda Surtees, Newsletter Editor, meet in September with the school as there is a possibility they may be able to print the newsletter a bit cheaper. Mr. Ian HANRATTY, who was the sponsor for the newsletter has left the area and the Partnership would like to offer their grateful thanks for his sponsorship which has kept the newsletter going.

The village planters, placed in various locations in the village, have once again been planted for the summer months, Miss Linda PEARS, Chair of the Partnership has again done a splendid job.

'Operation Spruce Up' which was carried out earlier this month has been a success with Front Street pavements, etc. getting a clean-up. The old toilet site in Watling Street has also been trimmed back. Leadgate Taskforce has donated two planters to be placed either side of the seat and Linda has kindly offered to plant them up. Some railings have been painted and Durham Road, St. Ives Road, Front Street and the top of Watling Street have also been cleaned. Some other issues, postponed as a result of weather conditions, are still to be actioned.

Work in Watling Wood, which was due to start on 17th July, 2017 was postponed and was due to start on 19th. A question concerning staffing costs has yet to be resolved.

The question of the Eden Miners' Institute, the 'Tute' was raised but as yet no information is available, however it was felt the premises should be used by everyone.

The 'Big Bash' which took place on 16th July was a huge success and very well organised.

As next year is the 100th anniversary of the ending of World War One it was suggested that the village do something to commemorate the occasion. A couple of suggestions put forward were a tea dance and the War Memorial in Durham Road being re-consecrated. If anyone is interested and would like to help, then please come to the Partnership's meeting on 8th October and tell us your suggestions, etc.

There will be no meeting in August, the next meeting will be Wednesday, 20th September, 2017 at 6.30 p.m. in the Community Centre.


Litter's a constant problem in the village and this month there has been a combined effort involving volunteers from the local community and various agencies to clean up the area.


