# PROGRESS REPORT ON OUR NEW ROAD:







#### **SURGERY NEWS - MISSED APPOINTMENTS:**

Waiting times for appointments can be long but this can be overcome with patients' help, if you are unable to keep your appointment please cancel it and allow someone else the chance to have it. To the end of April, the number of people who did not cancel was in the region of 186 per month, then in May there was a slight decrease, but unfortunately the numbers for June, July and August have drastically risen as can be seen below

#### **PARTNERSHIP NEWS:**

The month's meeting was held on Wednesday, 21<sup>st</sup> September, 2016 at 6.30 p.m. in the Community Centre. www.leadgatevillage.com is our village website.

Present at this month's meeting was Ms Kath CLEMENTS, from Derwentside Area Action Partnership, who gave a presentation of Durham County Council's budget review. Kath said the Council, in the last five years, had saved more than £180 million but over the next three years £64 million has to be saved and by 2020 £250 million has to be saved. Once again the Council is asking for the communities help in deciding where further spending cuts should be made. The Council's Budget Consultation 2017/18 closes on **Friday**, 7<sup>th</sup> **October**, 2016. A problem concerning traffic in Oak Terrace was mentioned, as was the fact the white lines at Pont Bungalows have not been re-painted.

The Chairperson, Linda PEARS told the meeting she had managed to sell some of the polyanthus from last year's planting of the planters and said the money for this year's planting is now due, in case the sponsors of the planters have forgotten, the amount due for two plantings if £45 and can be paid by **contacting Linda on 01207 505481.**

# **COUNCILLORS' REPORTS:**

<u>VILLA REAL BRIDGE</u>: Good progress is being made with the project – the road drainage system has been completed, kerb stones are being installed, street lighting is scheduled to be installed in October: the width of the adjacent road at West Parade has been increased (as per the

request of local residents) and road tarmac is being laid from the Villa Real end of the new road. Revised design work to improve the visual amenity from the new road to Leadgate Cricket Club (entering/leaving the village) has been submitted and joint discussions are to be arranged with the contractor.

<u>BT TELEPHONE BOXES</u>: BT are reviewing the usage of local telephone boxes across the area. Councillors have requested that telephone boxes with a reasonable public usage and in 'remote' areas are kept in their current location.

<u>WATLING WOOD</u>: A proportion (75%) of the £10k grant award from Tesco's 'Community Fund' for development of Watling Wood has been received. A Management Committee (including local residents) is being created to ensure all the objectives for the project are achieved.

**ROUND-A-BOUTS**: A query regarding the possibility of landscaping (flowers beds/wild flowers) the two round-a-bouts at Leadgate (Durham Road and Jolly Drovers) – similar to the three main round-a-bouts at Consett (Villa Real, Number One, Puddles Corner) have been submitted to Durham County Council.

# **POLICE NEWS**



# **AUTUMN/CHRISTMAS FAYRES:**



# VILLAGE CRICKET CLUB GETS A BOOST

Many of you may be wondering what is taking place at our village's cricket ground, well, I have found out, a new drainage system is being installed and the outfield playing area levelled. The Club has received £75,000 from 'Sport England's Protecting Playing Fields' funding scheme and also £10,000 match funding from the Derwent Valley Area Action Partnership.

The Club which was formed in 1904 has been an integral part of our village for over 100 years yet in recent years, due to severe winters and wet summers, has suffered from loss of fixtures and training opportunities, for both the Junior and Senior sides. The investment in the playing surface will significantly increase the quality of the playing environment and open up the ground to a number of alternative uses for community events as well as multi-sport participatory events delivered through partner agencies such as Leisureworks.

With the support of our local councillors, Watts STELLING and Alan SHIELD, refurbishment of the clubhouse has taken place resulting in new disabled and ladies toilets and improvements to the lounge and bar arears. These improvements have already borne fruit with the club seeing an increase in bookings for social functions helping the club to be self-sustainable and once again a focal point in the village and local community, the committee are pleased to say "There is a real buzz about the club".


